Wendy Red Star (b. 1981, Billings, Montana; lives and works in Portland, Oregon) is an Apsáalooke artist whose multidisciplinary practice is grounded in the histories, archives, and familial knowledge of the Apsáalooke Nation. Raised in the district of Pryor on the Crow reservation in Montana, her work grows from the stories passed through her family, the historical materials she encounters in her research, and the lineage that shapes her understanding of the past.

Her practice brings Apsáalooke histories into close relationship with the narratives preserved in U.S. archives. Guided by attention and clarity, she listens to inherited stories, reads archival records with care, and assembles fragments into forms that hold time, memory, and historical presence together.

Red Star received her MFA from the University of California, Los Angeles, and her BFA from Montana State University, Bozeman. She is the recipient of a MacArthur Fellowship (2024), a Smithsonian Artist Research Fellowship (2018), the Louis Comfort Tiffany Award (2017), the Bonnie Bronson Fellowship (2024), and the Infinity Award in Contemporary Photography and New Media (2024).

Her work has been exhibited nationally and internationally at institutions including The Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Museum of Modern Art, the Whitney Museum of American Art, the J. Paul Getty Museum, Fondation Cartier pour l'Art Contemporain, and the British Museum. In 2027, the National Portrait Gallery will present a major solo exhibition of her work.
