These materials embody the activity of cleaning, the untold stories of domestic labor, and mass produced disposable culture. Reconfiguring the found bristles in various optical compositions, the sculptures are transformed into renewed objects of desire. For NADA House on Governors Island, Rosenberg presents a selection of these altered objects at the end of a long, dark corridor upstairs in House 404A. Arranged within a brightly lit closet, there is room for only one person to enter and examine the intricate works.

**Michelle Rosenberg** (b. Manchester, United Kingdom) currently lives and works in New York City. She holds an MFA in Combined Media from Hunter College (New York, NY), BFA & B.Architecture from Rhode Island School of Design (Providence, RI), and was a resident at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture (Skowhegan, Maine).
