Iria Leino (b. 1932, Helsinki, Finland; d. 2022, New York, NY) was a visual artist and trailblazer of the SoHo loft scene in New York City. Upon receiving a degree from the Academy of Fine Arts, Helsinki in 1955, Leino moved to Paris to continue her studies at the prestigious École des Beaux-Arts. Here, she caught the attention of the late Madame Grès—the queen of haute couture—and Karl Lagerfeld, thus launching her career as a fashion model of international renown. Despite being embraced by the world of luxury, she suffered immensely during this time; at the peak of her success in 1964, Leino abandoned her modeling career and relocated to New York City's then-epicenter of the bohemian community, SoHo. In 1968, Leino suffered a severe skull injury that left her in a coma for weeks. This health crisis proved to be a turning point: upon her recovery, Leino embraced a monastic Buddhist discipline, channeling newfound spiritual insight into her studio practice.

During her lifetime, Leino's work largely remained hidden from the public eye, with notable exceptions. In 1973, Leino was included in the groundbreaking *Women Choose Women*, curated by Lucy Lippard, the first major large-scale presentation of female artists in New York. The same year, she participated in *Second Annual Contemporary Reflections*, Aldrich Museum of Contemporary Art, Ridgefield, CT. From the mid-1970s to her death in 2022, Leino garnered sporadic recognition in the form of museum exhibitions in Finland and Sweden, institutional patronage, as well as a multi-year installation at John F. Kennedy Airport's Finnair terminal. However, Leino's interests never allied with the commercial gallery system that seemingly flourished around her—in her mind, the competitive culture industry was all too similar to the fashion world she left behind so long ago.

Tanya Ling (b. 1966, Calcutta, India) received a degree from Central Saint Martins, London in 1989 prior to a career in the Parisian fashion industry. Upon her return to the UK, Ling, along with her husband William, opened the contemporary art gallery Bipasha Ghosh; in 1996 she produced her first exhibition of drawings in artist Gavin Turk's studio on the Charing Cross Road, London. Most recently, her work has been exhibited at Studio Cromie, Grottaglie, IT (2024); Ronchini, London (2024); Harper's, New York, Los Angeles and East Hampton (2023, 2022 and 2021); Taipei Dangdai (2023); NADA Miami (2022 and 2021); PM/AM, London (2022); Mayor Gallery, London (2021 and 2018); and Newport Street Gallery, London (2019 and 2017). Over 50 of Ling's works have been acquired by the Victoria and Albert Museum Prints and Drawings collection, in addition to a collection of paintings and sculptures acquired by Damien Hirst's Murderme collection. Ling lives and works in London.

Laure Mary (b. 1989, Bonneville, France) received degrees from École nationale supérieure des beaux-arts de Lyon; she is currently based in Paris. Most recently, Mary's work has been the subject of solo presentations at Dio Horia Gallery, Athens (2024 and 2021); Richard Heller Gallery, Santa Monica, CA (2022 and 2021); Domaine de Roueïre, Sud-Hérault, FR (2021); SEPTIEME Gallery, Paris (2020); and Museum of Contemporary Art, Lyon (2017).
