b. 1986, New York, NY. Lives and works in New York.

For two decades, Nin has deployed transgressive and fugitive strategies in a free-roaming artistic practice, from appropriating unobtainable social artefacts, to catching strangers off guard through the lens of his camera. The city itself is Nin's material, medium, and frame for an art fueled by the tension between public and private objects, signs and spaces. Over the past two years, Nin has developed a regular studio practice which sees rich experimentation in painting and sculpture with materials like glass, foam, wood, and metal. His series of candle soot paintings debuted at his first solo exhibition at Foreign & Domestic in 2024. The same space, in its raw state before conversion into a gallery, served as Nin's first studio residency in the spring of 2022.
