JUNGWON JAY HUR

Jungwon Jay Hur (b. 1996, South Korea) is a multidisciplinary artist whose practice examines themes of self-reflection, spirituality, and the intersection of personal and cultural narratives. Drawing from her South Korean heritage, she integrates acts of repetition with autobiographical elements imbued with universal symbolism, often incorporating motifs such as birds as metaphors for prayer, resistance, and transformation. Her work, encompassing painting, printmaking, and installation, invites viewers to engage with intangible sensations and moments of introspection, offering a space for connection and contemplation. Hur earned her MFA in Fine Art: Painting from the Slade School of Fine Art in 2022 and is based in London, UK.
