

BARIS GOKTURK

Baris Gokturk is an artist raised in Turkey and Puerto Rico, living and working in Brooklyn, New York. After graduating from Galatasaray High School in Istanbul and The New School in New York, Gokturk completed his master's degree in painting at Hunter College and in sculpture at Columbia University.

Recent museum projects and exhibitions include the Jewish Museum in New York, the Frost Museum in Miami, SECCA in Winston-Salem, and Pera Museum in Istanbul. He has also produced commissioned works for Columbia University's Butler Library and the Public Art Fund in New York. His recent solo exhibitions Public Secret and Scanner/Tarayan could be seen at Helena Anrather Gallery in New York and Galeri Bosfor in Istanbul.

Gokturk has exhibited his works in the United States and internationally in Germany, Spain, France, China, Korea, Croatia, Turkey and Puerto Rico. His works has been featured in ArtForum, The BOMB Magazine, and The Brooklyn Rail.

Gokturk was an ApexArt fellow in Seoul, artist-in-residence at ISCP, LMCC and YADDO and a participant in Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture as well as SOMA Mexico. He currently teaches at Parsons School of Design and runs an arts program for the neurology department at Johns Hopkins University. Gokturk is the founding member of Junte, a culture

and arts project in Puerto Rico currently being incubated by The New Museum's NEW INC and



a current fellow at NXTHVN in New Haven, CT.
