

Zoë Buckman (b. 1985 Hackney, East London) is a multi-disciplinary artist working in sculpture, installation, and photography, exploring themes of Feminism, mortality, and equality. She lives and works in Brooklyn, NY. Buckman studied at the International Center of Photography (ICP), was awarded an Art Matters Grant in 2017, The Art Change Maker Award 2019 at The New Jersey Visual Arts Center, and The Art and Social Impact Award 2020 at Baxter St NYC, and completed a residency at Mana Contemporary in 2017.

Notable solo shows have included *No Bleach Thick Enough*, at Pippy Houldsworth Gallery, London, *Heavy Rag* at Fort Gansevoort Gallery, New York, *Let Her Rave* at Gavlak Gallery Los Angeles, *Imprison Her Soft Hand* at Project for Empty Space, Newark; Every Curve at PAPILLION ART, Los Angeles; and *Present Life* at Garis & Hahn Gallery, New York. Group shows include those at The Museum of Art and Design NYC, MOCA, Virginia, The Camden Arts Centre, London, The Studio Museum in Harlem, The Children's Museum of the Arts, Paul Kasmin Gallery NY, Goodman Gallery South Africa, Jack Shainman Gallery NY, Monique Meloche Chicago, NYU Florence Italy, Grunwald Art Gallery Indiana, the Democratic National Convention Philadelphia, the National Center for Civil and Human Rights Atlanta, and The National Museum of African-American History & Culture Washington, DC.

Public works include a mural, We Hold These Truths To Be Self-Evident, in collaboration with Natalie Frank at the Ford Foundation Live Gallery of New York Live Arts in NYC. In February 2018 Buckman unveiled her first Public Sculpture presented by Art Production Fund on Sunset Blvd, Los Angeles, a large-scale outdoor version of her neon sculpture Champ, which has been up for three years.

Later this year Buckman will be included in the group show *Garmenting: Costume of Contemporary Art* at the Museum of Arts and Design, New York, NY. She will also exhibit in the joint show *We Flew Over the Wild Winds of Wild Fires* at Mother Gallery with Vanessa German. A solo show at Pippy Houldsworth Gallery is scheduled for 2022.

Marcy Hermansader (b. 1951 Glen Cove, NY) is a mixed media artist living and working in Vermont. Hermansader's unique style of painting involves using a variety of materials that evoke the natural world, including thread, collage, fabric, paint, and colored pencil. Her purposeful choice of materials grows out of the subjects of her work—often sylvan, otherworldly landscapes and renderings of flora and fauna—as subject and emotion preclude the means of expression Hermansader takes. Her work tends to alternate between inward focus and engagement with issues in the larger world, such as war, industrial accidents, and the experiences of people with disabilities. Regardless of her content, her pieces are deeply personal reflections on the world around her, whether that be relationships with nature or other people.

Hermansader earned a BFA from Philadelphia College of Art, where she studied with Cynthia Carlson, Ree Morton, and Rafael Ferrer. She has had solo shows across the United States, including those at Williams College Museum of Art (Williamstown, MA), The Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts (Philadelphia, PA), and the DeCordova Museum (Lincoln, MA), among others. Hermansader has participated in over fifty group exhibitions including *Interfaces: Outsider Art and the Mainstream* at the Philadelphia Museum of Art (Philadelphia, PA), *The Drawn Page* at the Aldrich Museum (Ridgefield, CT), and *Curator's Choice* at the Bronx Museum (Bronx, NY). Her work can be found in the permanent collections of various museums, including the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Bowdoin College Museum (Brunswick, ME), and The Minneapolis Institute of Art (Minneapolis, MN).

Jenny Morgan (b. 1982 Salt Lake City, UT) is a painter living and working in Brooklyn, NY. Morgan's diaphanous paintings are inhabited by hyper-realistic figures ebbing in and out of focus, merging into landscape or diffusing gently into a painterly fog. There is a razor's edge quality in the calm precision of Morgan's deliberate brush stroke, which can be quick and expressive as well as invisible and exact. Her work recalls numerous art historical references, from Venetian reclining nudes to playful rococo paintings, all while imbuing a hypnotic, euphoric, and hyper-present setting.

Morgan holds a BA from the Rocky Mountain College of Art and Design (Denver, CO) and an MFA from the School of Visual Arts (New York, NY). Morgan's work has received critical attention in numerous publications including articles in Whitewall, Modern Painters, The Village Voice, The Denver Post, and the cover feature of Juxtapoz in May 2013. She celebrated her first solo museum exhibition Skin Deep with The Museum of Contemporary Art Denver (Denver, CO) in 2017. Her 2013 solo exhibition How To Find A Ghost was named one of the top 100 fall shows worldwide by Modern Painters. Morgan has realized several portraiture commissions for publications including The New York Times Magazine and New York Magazine. Her work is currently being exhibited in Women of Now at the Green Family Art Foundation (Dallas, TX). She has had solo exhibitions in New York, London, Colorado, Utah, Indiana, New Mexico, and has been in numerous group exhibitions including at the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery (Washington, D.C.), the 92Y Tribeca (New York, NY) and Postmasters Gallery (Rome, Italy). Her work is represented in the collections of the Purdue University Art Gallery (West Lafayette, IN), Museum of Contemporary Art Jacksonville (Jacksonville, FL), Muskegon Museum of Art (Muskegon, MI), University of Maryland's Stamp Student Union Art Collection (College Park, MD), New Mexico State University (Las Cruces, NM) Flint Institute of Arts (Flint, MI), as well as major private collections throughout the world.

Emilie Louise Gossiaux (b. 1989 New Orleans, Louisiana) is an interdisciplinary artist currently based in New York City. Since losing her vision in 2010, Gossiaux's altered experience of the world has influenced her practice to grow—working with drawings, paintings, sculptures, and installations to represent the other methods in which she experiences vision, such as through dreams, memories, and verbal description. Creating works based on internal imagery, she relies solely on her sense of touch and proprioception to recall the physicality of a person, place, or thing in relation to her body. Working through this process, Gossiaux builds emotionally and psychologically resonant spaces that are uncanny, humorous, intimate, and sincere.

Gossiaux has had solo shows at Mother Gallery in Beacon, NY, and False Flag Gallery in New York, NY. Her work has shown internationally in numerous group shows at The Aldrich Contemporary Art Museum (Ridgefield, CT), MoMA PS1 (New York, NY), The Krannert Art Museum (Champagne, IL), Museum für Moderne Kunst (Frankfurt, DE), The Shed (New York, NY), SculptureCenter (New York, NY), The Cooper Hewitt (New York, NY), Pippy Houldsworth (London, UK), and The Smithsonian Institute of Art (Washington, DC), among others. She has won several honors and awards, including The John F. Kennedy Center's VSA Prize for Excellence in 2013, the Elliot Lash Memorial Prize for Excellence in Sculpture in 2014, and a Wynn Newhouse Award in 2018. She received her BFA from the Cooper Union School of Art in 2014, and her MFA from Yale University in Sculpture in 2019.

Anders Hamilton (b. 1992, Everett, WA) was raised in Fargo, North Dakota and currently lives and works in Brooklyn, NY. His Obelisk sculptures are composed of a variety of materials including ceramic, glaze, rare earth oxide, and found twigs. In these delicate works, the foliage on each twig undergoes a process of transformation akin to cremation. Each leaf is coated in several thin layers of porcelain slip and fired in a kiln. This turns the leaf to ash, leaving behind only a paper thin ceramic shell, which is glazed shut to seal the remains within. Each ceramic leaf therefore acts as a container for its own cremated ash, a ghost of its previous form. Hamilton then applies glaze containing rare earth oxide as a source of color. These oxides have the uncanny ability to change in response to their light source. Olive becomes pink, lavender becomes gray, green becomes yellow. Aside from the poetics of working with "rare earth" this color changing effect makes visible a transfer of energy through the absorption or refraction of light rays. It is also descriptive of the biological feeding process of plants. Glucose produced in the leaves is distributed throughout the plant to provide nourishment and stimulate growth.

Hamilton received his BFA from the University of Minnesota (Minneapolis, MN) in 2015. He is a studio manager for BKLYN CLAY (Brooklyn, NY) and a designer for the BKLYN CLAY Made line. He has exhibited his work recently at Fisher Parrish Gallery (Brooklyn, NY) and the Pratt Institute (Brooklyn, NY).

Alexandra Rubinstein (b. 1988 Yekaterinburg, Russia) is a Brooklyn-based conceptual artist working in painting, drawing and mixed media. Inspired by her adolescent (and ongoing) trauma, Rubinstien's work explores the relationships between gender, power, consumption, and culture. By combining mundane and familiar images with the explicit in rich, thick color, she creates a shock-value painted narrative that challenges long-standing social constructs. Though rarely depicting women, her work still includes both the (cisgender, heterosexual) female gaze and presence, via the bodies of men, depicted as passive and subject to scrutiny. With the sole focus on male genitalia—and a keen eye for gendered irony—Rubinstein introduces a conversation about traditional masculinity and how it intimidates, oppresses, and has played a role in shaping our present social landscape.

Rubinstein immigrated to the United States in 1997 and earned her BFA from Carnegie Mellon University (Pittsburgh, PA) in 2010. She has been working in New York ever since. Rubinstein has exhibited at The Hewitt Gallery of Art (Marymount Manhattan College, New York, NY), Spring Break Art Fair (New York, NY), Satellite Art Show (Brooklyn, NY), The Established Gallery (Brooklyn, NY), The Untitled Space (New York, NY), The Outlet (Brooklyn NY), The Royal (Brooklyn, NY), Proto Gallery (Hoboken, NJ), Fort Wayne Museum of Art (Fort Wayne, IN), and The Wing (Brooklyn, NY). Her work has been featured in numerous publications, including Hyperallergic, Cosmopolitan, Huffington Post, Paper Mag, Juxtapoz, Forbes, GQ, Playboy, Broad City, Desus and Nero. Her work was also featured on HBO news program *Real Time with Bill Maher*.
